## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

RESOLUTIONS URGING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO RENDER ALL POSSIBLE AID TO THE STRICKEN WORCESTER AREA OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Whereas*, On the evening of June the ninth central Massachusetts, particularly the area in the vicinity of the city of Worcester, was severely hit by a tornado; and

*Whereas*, Many lives were lost and much property damage resulted from the destructive force and fury of the storm; and

*Whereas*, Many families are now homeless and many persons lie injured as a result thereof; now therefore be it

*Resolved*, That the Senate of Massachusetts respectfully urges the Congress of the United States to do everything possible to effect a program to aid in the relief of suffering in the Worcester area of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and be it further

*Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be sent forthwith by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the President of the United States, to the presiding officer of each branch of the Congress, and to the members thereof from this Commonwealth.
