RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY TO BE MADE BY THE COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO STUDY THE CARE, TREATMENT AND COMMITMENT OF THE CRIMINALLY INSANE AND DEFECTIVE DELINQUENTS, AND EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH SAID COMMISSION SHALL FILE ITS REPORT.

1 Resolved, That the unpaid special commission es-2 tablished by chapter seventy-six of the resolves of the 3 current year, for the purpose of making an investiga-4 tion and study relative to the care, treatment and 5 commitment of the criminally insane and defective 6 delinquents shall, in making its investigation and 7 study, consider the subject matter of current house 8 document numbered 2817, directing the department 9 of correction to investigate and study the cases of all 10 persons held in defective delinquent departments. 11 Said commission shall, in making its investigation 12 and study, have the assistance and co-operation of the 13 department of correction and shall have access to the 14 records of said department. Said commission may 15 travel within and without the commonwealth and 16 may expend for clerical and other assistance and ex-17 penses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. 18 Said commission shall report to the general court the 19 results of its investigation and its recommendations. 20 if any, together with drafts of such legislation as may 21 be necessary to carry such recommendations into

22 effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house

23 of representatives from time to time and by filing a

24 final report not later than April fifteenth in the year

25 nineteen hundred and fifty-four.
