AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY THE STATE SECRETARY OF A SUPERVISOR OF PUBLIC DOCUMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter nine of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding thereto the following
3 section:—

4 *Section 25.* The state secretary shall with the ap-
5 proval of the governor and council appoint a com-
6 petent person as supervisor of public documents.
7 Said supervisor, under the supervision of the secre-
8 tary, shall distribute all publications of the common-
9 wealth as required under General Laws, chapter
10 five, section one, and perform such other duties as
11 may be required by law or as may be determined by
12 the secretary.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall not effect the tenure of
2 the present supervisor of public documents.
