AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PORTIONS OF ROUTE 10.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The department of public works is
2 hereby authorized and directed to reconstruct Route
3 10 going southwesterly from Northampton to East-
4 hampton, from the beginning of the state highway
5 in Northampton to the Easthampton town line.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes of this act the de-
2 partment of public works may expend such sums as
3 may hereafter be appropriated therefor.
