The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF JUSTICES OF DISTRICT COURTS WHILE ACTING IN CERTAIN APPELLATE DIVISIONS THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The second paragraph of section 108 of chapter 231
2 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by
3 chapter 683 of the acts of 1949, is hereby further
4 amended by striking out, in line 4, the word "forty"
5 and inserting in place thereof the word: — fifty, —
6 so as to read as follows: — A justice acting in the ap-
7 pellate division of a district court other than the court
8 of which he is a justice, shall be allowed in addition to
9 his compensation as such justice a sum which, added
10 thereto, will aggregate fifty dollars, for each day he
11 so acts, and his necessary traveling expenses, incidental
12 expenses and clerical assistance while so acting, to be
13 paid by the county in which he so acts, upon his certifi-
14 cate approved by the county commissioners; and no
15 deduction shall be made from the compensation of
16 such justice under section six of chapter two hundred
17 and eighteen on account of compensation paid to a
18 special justice of his court for service at any session
19 which such justice is unable to hold by reason of so
20 acting.
