AN ACT RELATIVE TO TENURE OF OFFICE OF THE PRESENT INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SECOND ASSISTANT CITY CLERK IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Helen DeFino, the incumbent of the
2 office of second assistant city clerk in the city of
3 Worcester, is hereby given unlimited tenure of office
4 therein, and shall not be involuntarily separated
5 from her service as such, except for cause after a
6 hearing and a decision by the appointing authority.
7 Said decision may be appealed from to the city council
8 within five days after the giving of notice thereof by
9 the appointing authority, and the city council shall
10 give a hearing and decision thereon within thirty
11 days after the filing of a request for a hearing. The
12 decision of the city council may, within thirty days
13 after notice to the employee of the decision of the
14 city council, be appealed from to the district court
15 subject to and in accordance with the provisions of
16 section forty-five of chapter thirty-one of the General
17 Laws to the same extent as if the office were classified
18 under said chapter thirty-one.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 acceptance, in the current year, by vote of the city
3 council of said city.
