AN ACT TO PLACE TELEPHONE COMPANY EMPLOYEES  
UNDER THE PROTECTION OF THE WORKMEN'S COM-  
PENSATION ACT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 Paragraph (4) of the General Laws, chapter 152,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out the words "persons  
3 employed by telephone companies subject to the fed-  
4 eral communications act" in the second paragraph  
5 thereof.
