### AN ACT TO FACILITATE THE PAYMENT OF CLAIMS UNDER THE MASSACHUSETTS EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ACT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 151A of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by the addition of the following new section:—

3 *Section 75.* (a) Whenever an employee is laid off  
4 or terminated from employment, the employer shall  
5 furnish such employee an itemized monthly record  
6 of any wages earned while in the employment of the  
7 employer from the first day of the first four of the  
8 five most recently completed quarters and up to and  
9 including the last day of employment with such em-  
10 ployer.

11 (b) The wage record required under this section shall  
12 be furnished the employee, no later than seven days  
13 after being laid off or terminated from employment.

14 (c) The director shall be required to assess and col-  
15 lect a penalty of five dollars a day from any employer,  
16 for the period for which the employer fails to furnish  
17 the wage record required by this section.

The first of the amendments proposed by the committee is a change in the method of selecting the members of the board of directors of the corporation.

### ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION

#### SECTION 1. Officers and Directors

The first section of this article provides that the officers and directors of the corporation shall be elected by the stockholders at a regular meeting of the corporation to be held on the first day of the month of January in each year.

The second section of this article provides that the directors of the corporation shall have the right to elect and remove the officers of the corporation and to fill all vacancies that may occur in the office of any officer.

The third section of this article provides that the officers of the corporation shall hold their offices until the next meeting of the stockholders at which they are eligible for re-election.
