The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MINIMUM SALARIES OF PUBLIC SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by adding thereto the following new section: —
3 *Section 61A.* The minimum salary, exclusive of
4 travel, for public school superintendents in cities,
5 towns, unions and districts shall be as follows: — in
6 cities, towns, unions and districts with a population of
7 five thousand or less, the minimum salary shall be not
8 less than sixty-five hundred dollars; in cities, towns,
9 unions and districts with a population of five thousand
10 to fifteen thousand, the minimum salary shall be not
11 less than seventy-five hundred dollars; in cities, towns,
12 unions and districts with a population of fifteen
13 thousand to twenty-five thousand, the minimum
14 salary shall be not less than eighty-five hundred dol-
15 lars; in cities, towns, unions and districts with a
16 population of twenty-five thousand to fifty thousand,
17 the minimum salary shall be not less than ninety-five
18 hundred dollars; in cities, towns, unions and dis-
19 tricts with a population over fifty thousand, the mini-
20 mum salary shall be not less than ten thousand five
21 hundred dollars; and the most recent census figures,
22 whether they be state or federal, shall be used in de-
23 termining population.
