AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN POLICE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 695 of the acts
2 of 1951 is hereby amended by inserting after the word
3 "sections" in line 5 the words: — fifty-six to sixty,
4 inclusive, or sections, — so as to read as follows: —
5 *Section 1.* Notwithstanding the provisions of section
6 eighty-five G of chapter thirty-two of the General
7 Laws, any member of the police department of the
8 city of New Bedford who is hereafter retired under
9 the provisions of sections fifty-six to sixty, inclusive,
10 or sections eighty-three to eighty-five F, inclusive, of
11 said chapter thirty-two, and who was appointed a
12 reserve police officer prior to July first, nineteen hun-
13 dred and thirty-seven, shall, for the purpose of such
14 retirement, be accredited with his service as such re-
15 serve police officer as a part of his continuous service.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 acceptance, within five years from the date of its
3 passage, by vote of the city council of said city, sub-
4 ject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.
