AN ACT MAKING GEORGE C. ELLIOTT ELIGIBLE TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF POLICEMAN IN THE TOWN OF NORTH ATTLEBOROUGH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. George C. Elliott of the town of North
2 Attleborough is hereby made eligible to apply for,
3 and to take, a civil service examination for appoint-
4 ment to the position of policeman in the town of
5 North Attleborough, notwithstanding that, at the
6 time of filing such application, he is over thirty-five
7 years of age.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
