The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

AN ACT EMPOWERING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO PREPARE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE GARAGE AUTHORIZED UNDER BOSTON COMMON AND THE APPROACHES THERETO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 294 of the acts of
2 1946 is hereby amended by striking out, in the last
3 sentence, the words "of the department of public
4 works and of the transit commission of said city" and
5 inserting in place thereof the words: — of the com-
6 missioner of public works of said city.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 2 is hereby further amended
2 by adding at the end the following paragraph: —
3 For the purpose of inviting proposals for such
4 contract and lease, said city acting as aforesaid is
5 hereby authorized, anything in this act to the contrary
6 notwithstanding, to prepare at its expense plans and
7 specifications for the garage and approaches thereto
8 including the underground passageway and, if it is to
9 be included in such contract and lease, the two-lane
10 traffic tunnel; provided, however, that if plans and
11 specifications are so prepared, the contract and lease
12 shall require the lessee to reimburse the city for the
13 cost thereof simultaneously with the execution of such
14 contract and lease.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK
