RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF ALL COMPONENTS OF CONSUMER CREDIT IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, ESPECIALLY AS RELATED TO THEIR EFFECT, DIRECT OR INDIRECT, ON EMPLOYMENT.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, which shall
2 consist of three members of the senate to be desig-
3 nated by the president thereof, four members of the
4 house of representatives, to be designated by the
5 speaker thereof, and two persons to be appointed by
6 the governor, is hereby established for the purpose of
7 making an investigation and study of the laws, rules,
8 regulations and other pertinent information pertain-
9 ing to the status of all components of consumer credit
10 in the commonwealth of Massachusetts. Special at-
11 tention shall be given by the commission to the
12 effect, direct and indirect, of consumer credit on em-
13 ployment in private industry in the commonwealth.
14 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in
15 the state house or elsewhere, may travel within or
16 without the commonwealth, and may expend for
17 clerical and other services an expense for such sums as
18 may be appropriated therefor. Said commission shall
19 report to the general court the results of its investiga-
20 tion and study, and its recommendations, if any, to-

21 gether with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
 22 certain recommendations into effect, by filing the
 23 same with the clerk of the house of representatives on
 24 or before the first Wednesday in December of the
 25 current year.
