## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CHERRY VALLEY WATER DISTRICT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 381 of the acts of 1910 is  
2 hereby amended by striking out section 2 and in-  
3 serting in place thereof the following:—

4 *Section 2.* For the purposes aforesaid, the said  
5 water district acting by and through its board of  
6 water commissioners hereinafter provided for, may  
7 contract with any municipality acting through its  
8 water department, or with any water company, or  
9 with any water district, for whatever water it may  
10 require, authority to furnish same being hereby  
11 granted, and may take or acquire by purchase, or  
12 otherwise, from Henshaw pond, so called, situated in  
13 Leicester, whatever quantity of water and water  
14 rights connected with such lands and any springs and  
15 streams percolating or running through the same,  
16 and situated in the town of Leicester lying adjacent  
17 to said Henshaw pond.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 381 is hereby further  
2 amended by striking out section 7 and inserting in  
3 place thereof the following:—

4 *Section 7.* Said water district may make such  
5 contracts with individuals, corporations, other water

6 districts, water companies, and the town of Leicester  
7 for supplying water as may be agreed upon, and may  
8 extend its pipe lines for that purpose, subject to the  
9 direction of the selectmen of the town of Leicester,  
10 through the highways of said town lying outside the  
11 corporate limits of said water district, and may ex-  
12 tend its pipe lines into the town of Oxford for a dis-  
13 tance not exceeding nine thousand feet from the  
14 boundary line between the towns of Leicester and  
15 Oxford, subject to the direction of the selectmen of  
16 the town of Oxford; and may extend its pipes into  
17 the town of Charlton for a distance not exceeding six  
18 thousand feet from the westerly boundary line of the  
19 town of Charlton, subject to the direction of the se-  
20 lectmen of the town of Charlton; it may also extend  
21 its pipes into the town of Auburn for a distance not  
22 exceeding six thousand feet from the boundary line  
23 between the town of Leicester and Auburn, subject  
24 to the direction of the selectmen of the town of  
25 Auburn.
