AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TIME FOR SUBMITTING TO VOTERS  
THE QUESTION OF LICENSING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC  
BEVERAGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 138 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by section 1 of chapter 207 of the acts of  
3 1936, is hereby further amended by striking out the  
4 first three lines of section 11 and substituting therefor  
5 the following:— The state secretary shall cause to  
6 be placed on the official ballot used in cities and  
7 towns at the state election held in the year nine-  
8 teen hundred and forty-eight and at state elections  
9 held every four years thereafter, — and by striking  
10 out, in line 4 of the paragraph next following para-  
11 graph (e) of said section 11, the word “two” and  
12 substituting therefor the word:— four.

## The Compendium of Statutes

(As far as the Laws of the United States are concerned)

As far as the Laws of the United States are concerned, the  
purpose of this Compendium is to provide a  
convenient and accurate reference to the  
laws of the United States.

The Compendium of the Laws of the United States  
is divided into two parts, and the authority of the  
United States is as follows:

1. Chapter 128 of the General Laws, as amended.
2. Amended by section 1 of chapter 205 of the acts of  
the 55th Congress, further amended by section 1 of the  
acts of the 56th Congress, and section 1 of the acts of the  
57th Congress.
3. The state university shall have the right to  
be placed on the official list of the state.
4. Towns of the state situated in the year 1900  
shall be included and forty-eight and in that year  
shall every ten years thereafter, and by striking  
out in line 4 of the paragraph next following the  
word "two" in section 11 the word "two" and  
substituting therefor the word "four".
