AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ABATEMENT OF TAXES ON PROPERTY AFFECTED BY THE DISASTER OF JUNE NINTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND FIFTY-THREE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

3 filing applications for abatement of real estate taxes,
4 the board of assessors in each city or town affected by
5 the tornado of June ninth, nineteen hundred and
6 fifty-three, shall accept applications for abatement on
7 real estate taxes as provided in chapter five hundred
8 and sixty-eight of the acts of nineteen hundred and
9 fifty-three and grant relief therefor up to and includ-
10 ing October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.
