## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

AN ACT EXEMPTING THE CITY OF LAWRENCE FROM CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS IN THE LAW RELATIVE TO EVENING CLASSES IN INDUSTRIAL AND OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The restriction in the definition of  
2 "Evening class" in section one of chapter seventy-  
3 four of the General Laws upon evening classes in inde-  
4 pendent industrial schools or independent distributive  
5 occupations schools, according to which instruction in  
6 such classes shall be given only to pupils employed  
7 during the day in work to which the instruction so  
8 given applies, shall not apply to industrial or occupa-  
9 tional schools maintained by the city of Lawrence, for  
10 a period of three years after the effective date of this  
11 act.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
