RESOLVE ESTABLISHING AN UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION
TO STUDY AND REVISE THE LAWS RELATING TO INDUS-
TRIAL HOMEWORK.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of two members of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, and three persons to be appointed by the
6 governor, is hereby established to make a survey
7 and study of the laws of the commonwealth relating
8 to industrial homework, with a view to the revision
9 and codification of said laws and to the recommending
10 of such changes therein and additions thereto as may
11 appear necessary or desirable. Said commission shall
12 hold hearings, shall be provided with quarters in the
13 state house or elsewhere, and may expend for expenses
14 and legal, clerical and other assistance such sums as
15 may be appropriated therefor. Said commission shall
16 report to the general court the results of its survey
17 and study, and its recommendations, if any, together
18 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said rec-
19 ommendations into effect, by filing the same with the
20 clerk of the house of representatives not later than
21 the first Wednesday of December in the current year.
