RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE STUDY BY THE
SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO STUDY AND
REVISE THE LAWS RELATING TO PUBLIC WELFARE.

1 *Resolved*, That the commission established by
2 chapter thirty-three of the resolves of nineteen
3 hundred and fifty-three, and the scope of its study
4 increased by chapter seventy-five of the resolves of
5 said year, shall in making its study, consider the
6 subject matter of current senate document numbered
7 507, relative to new commitments or transfers of
8 certain persons committed to the youth service board;
9 of current senate document numbered 513, relative
10 to making certain changes in the law relating to
11 persons who are permanently and totally disabled;
12 and of current house document numbered 1762,
13 relative to changes in the program of assistance for
14 persons permanently disabled.
