RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY OF THE LAWS RELATIVE TO CERTAIN SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND THE REORGANIZATION THEREOF, AND OF THE FEASIBILITY OF PROVIDING ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO CERTAIN TOWNS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, EQUIPPING AND FURNISHING OF SCHOOLS.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission
2 established by chapter forty-six of the resolves of
3 nineteen hundred and fifty-three for the purpose of
4 making an investigation and study of the laws relative
5 to certain school districts and the reorganization
6 thereof, and of the feasibility of providing additional
7 financial assistance to certain towns for the construc-
8 tion, equipping and furnishing of schools shall, in
9 making its investigation and study, consider the
10 subject matter of the investigation and study proposed
11 by current house document numbered 12, relative to
12 state aid for education, and the subject matter of
13 current house document numbered 365, relative to
14 the total construction grant by the commonwealth
15 for certain public school buildings.
