RESOLVE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE COMMISSION ON ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO CERTAIN PROPOSED LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES.

1 *Resolved*, That the commission on administration
2 and finance is hereby authorized and directed to make
3 an investigation and study of the subject matter of
4 current house document numbered 1327, relative to
5 providing for standard administration of emergency
6 first-aid medical services to state employees during
7 their hours of employment, of current house document
8 numbered 1732, relative to the health and safety of
9 employees, and of current house document numbered
10 2241, relative to providing medical attention for all
11 employees at the Walter E. Fernald State School.
12 Said commission shall report to the general court the
13 results of its investigation and study, and its recom-
14 mendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation
15 necessary to carry such recommendations into effect,
16 by filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
17 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday of De-
18 cember in the current year.
