
By Mr. Toomey of Cambridge, petition of John J. Toomey, Michael F. Skerry and John M. Shea that persons receiving pensions and who are elected by city councils in Plan E cities be permitted to receive compensation attached to the positions they are elected to. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Four.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN PERSONS RECEIVING PENSIONS ELECTED BY THE COUNCIL IN PLAN E CITIES MAY RECEIVE COMPENSATION THEREFOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 91 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as
2 amended, is hereby further amended by striking out
3 the sentence as amended by chapter 264 of the acts
4 of 1950 and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence:—Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions
6 of this section or similar provisions of any special law,
7 a person who, while receiving such a pension or retire-
8 ment allowance, is appointed for a term of years to a
9 position by the governor with or without the advice
10 and consent of the council or is appointed for a term
11 of years to a position by the mayor or city manager
12 of any city with or without confirmation by the city
13 council or in Plan E cities elected for a term of years
14 by the city council shall be paid the compensation
15 attached to the position to which he is appointed;
16 provided, that he files with the treasurer of the gov-
17 ernmental unit paying such pension or allowance, a
18 written statement wherein he waives and renounces
19 for himself, his heirs and his legal representatives his
20 right to receive the same, for the period during which
21 such compensation is payable.
