AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE SALE AFTER NINETY DAYS BY GARAGE OWNERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES PLACED WITH THEM AFTER BEING REMOVED FROM THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Any motor vehicle placed in the care of a garage
- 2 by any duly constituted law officer after being re-
- 3 moved from the scene of an accident may after ninety
- 4 days be sold by such garage owner if he has not been
- 5 paid for work and labor, storage, care and diligence
- 6 in connection therewith.
