RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO EXAMINE THE STRUCTURE OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, es-
2 tablished by chapter seventy-five of the resolves of
3 nineteen hundred and forty-nine to examine the
4 structure of the state government, is hereby revived
5 and continued for the purpose of continuing its in-
6 vestigation and study relative to the study or the
7 salary classifications of state employees. Said com-
8 mission shall be provided with quarters in the state
9 house or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may require
10 by summons the attendance and testimony under
11 oath of witnesses and the production of books and
12 papers, may travel within and without the common-
13 wealth, and may expend for legal, clerical and other
14 assistance and for expenses the unexpended balance
15 of any sums appropriated under item 0261-00 of sec-
16 tion two of chapter four hundred and eighty-nine of
17 the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-three, and such
18 additional sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said
19 commission shall report to the general court the results
20 of its investigation and study hereunder, and its
21 recommendations, together with drafts of legislation
22 necessary to carry such recommendations into effect,
23 by filing the same with the clerk of the house of
24 representatives on or before the fifteenth day of
25 March, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.
