AN ACT RELATIVE TO SICK LEAVE FOR EMPLOYEES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS WHO ARE EXCLUDED OR REMOVED FROM EMPLOYMENT ON ACCOUNT OF TUBERCULOSIS IN A COMMUNICABLE FORM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The eighth sentence of section 55B of chapter 71 of
2 the General Laws, as appearing in chapter 469 of the
3 acts of 1952, is hereby amended by inserting after the
4 word "teacher" in line 7 the words:— or other em-
5 ployee, — so as to read as follows:— Any teacher,
6 other than a teacher in the public schools, or any other
7 employee excluded or removed from employment on
8 account of tuberculosis in a communicable form shall
9 be carried on sick leave with pay for such period as
10 he may be entitled to under the regulations of the
11 school committee or other school officers; and any
12 teacher or other employee in the public schools ex-
13 cluded or removed from employment on account of
14 tuberculosis in a communicable form shall be carried
15 on sick leave with pay for the entire period of such
16 exclusion or removal, but in no case for more than
17 two years, and for such further additional period as
18 he may be entitled to under the regulations of the
19 school committee or other school officers.
