AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE CIVIL SERVICE STATUS OF CERTAIN PERSONS NOW HOLDING ON A TEMPORARY BASIS OTHER POSITIONS IN THE DIVISION OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, Edward A. Bouthilette,
3 Thomas P. Dolan, Grace S. LaBonte, Beatrice W.
4 Lyman, John T. Manning, Iris Marshall, Benjamin
5 Maslowski, William J. McKay and Arvo W. Sipila,
6 who were employed on a permanent basis in the posi-
7 tion of principal interviewer with bonus, in the divi-
8 sion of employment security, when they were tem-
9 porarily transferred to other positions in the division
10 of employment security, shall unless subsequently per-
11 manently appointed or promoted to other positions,
12 continue to hold the said status of principal interviewer
13 with bonus which they held prior to said temporary
14 transfer. All time served on a temporary transfer
15 basis shall be carried as creditable service in respect
16 to retirement, civil service and other rights, and with-
17 out impairment of any rights held by said persons in
18 the position of principal interviewer with bonus.
