Whereas, Walter C. Howey has, throughout his long and brilliant career exhibited those rare qualities of human nature which elevated him to the highest level in his profession, being ever mindful of his duty to the public which he served through the printed word; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the Massachusetts Senate deeply mourns the loss of Walter C. Howey and hereby expresses its regret at his passing and extends to his bereaved family its sympathy; and be it further
