AN ACT INCREASING THE DETAIL FOR POLICE AND DETECTIVE SERVICE IN THE OFFICE OF THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY FOR THE SUFFOLK DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 12 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out section 21, as appearing in the Tercente-
3 nary Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following
4 section:—

5 *Section 21.* The superintendent of police of Boston
6 shall, upon the written request of the district attorney
7 for the Suffolk district, detail for police and detective
8 service under his direction inspectors or police officers,
9 not exceeding twenty in number, to be designated by the
10 district attorney. Such inspectors or officers shall re-
11 ceive no extra compensation for services thus rendered,
12 and shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the
13 police department, unless relieved therefrom temporarily
14 by said superintendent or by the police commissioner of
15 Boston.
