AN ACT PERMITTING THE SALE OF BAIT ON SUNDAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws, as
2 amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the
3 end of the second paragraph thereof the following words:
4 — ; the sale of any bait for use by fishermen for non-
5 commercial purposes.
