

By Mr. Bly of Saugus, petition of Belden G. Bly, Jr., for legislation relative to residence requirements of members of the Board of Registration in Pharmacy. State Administration.

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**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Five.

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AN ACT RELATING TO THE RESIDENCE OF MEMBERS OF THE  
BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN PHARMACY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 22 of chapter 13 of the General Laws, as ap-  
2 pearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended  
3 by inserting after the word "prescriptions" in line 8 the  
4 words: — nor shall reside, — so as to read as follows: —  
5 *Section 22.* There shall be a board of registration in  
6 pharmacy, in the three following sections called the  
7 board, consisting of five persons, residents of the com-  
8 monwealth, who shall be skilled pharmacists, and shall  
9 have had ten consecutive years of practical experience in  
10 the compounding and dispensing of physicians' prescrip-  
11 tions, and shall actually be engaged in the drug business.  
12 Not more than one member shall have any financial  
13 interest in the sale of drugs, medicines and chemicals  
14 and the compounding and dispensing of physicians' pre-  
15 scriptions nor shall reside in the same councillor district.  
16 One member shall annually in November be appointed  
17 by the governor, with the advice and consent of the  
18 council, for five years from December first following.
