RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A SURVEY AND STUDY BY AN UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE ADVISABILITY OF ENLARGING THE FACILITIES AND PERMISSIBLE STUDENT ENROLLMENT OF THE MASSACHUSETTS MARITIME ACADEMY.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, consist-
2 ing of one member of the senate to be designated by the
3 president thereof, three members of the house of repre-
4 sentatives to be designated by the speaker thereof, and
5 three persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby
6 established for the purpose of making a survey and study
7 as to the advisability of enlarging the facilities and
8 permissible student enrollment of the Massachusetts
9 Maritime Academy. Such commission shall be provided
10 with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, and may
11 expend for necessary assistance and expenses such sums
12 as may be appropriated therefor. Said commission
13 shall report to the general court the results of its survey
14 and study and its recommendations, if any, together
15 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recom-
16 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk
17 of the house of representatives on or before the first
18 Wednesday of December in the year nineteen hundred
19 and fifty-five.
