
By Mr. Bly of Saugus, petition of Belden G. Bly, Jr., for the appointment of a special commission (including members of the General Court) to investigate registrations or licenses and the establishment of minimum standards of safety, health and care of children for summer camps. Public Health.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO REGISTRATIONS OR LICENSES, AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF MINIMUM STANDARDS OF SAFETY, HEALTH AND PROPER CARE OF CHILDREN FOR SUMMER CAMPS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of two members of the senate, to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives, to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, the commissioner of public safety, or a repre-
6 sentative appointed by him, the commissioner of public
7 health, or a representative appointed by him, and the
8 commissioner of commerce, or a representative ap-
9 pointed by him, is hereby established for the purpose of
10 making an investigation and study relative to registra-
11 tions or licenses and the establishment of minimum
12 standards of safety, health and proper care of children
13 for summer camps. Said commission shall be provided
14 with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, may hold
15 hearings, may travel within and without the common-
16 wealth, and may expend for clerical and other assist-
17 ance and for expenses such sums as may be appro-
18 priated therefor. Said commission shall report to the
19 general court the results of its investigation and study,

20 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of
21 legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into
22 effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of
23 representatives on or before the first Wednesday of
24 December in the current year.
