Whereas, Due to his great experience in penology he advocated a calm, watchful and waiting attitude by reason of which the revolt ended without physical injury to any one; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the house of representatives of the general court extend to Warden John J. O'Brien congratulations for his unswerving devotion to duty and tact; and be it further
