AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT FOR ACCIDENTAL
DISABILITY OF PATRICK J. HAGGERTY, AN EMPLOYEE OF
THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same,
as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of general or special
2 law, and notwithstanding any action already taken by
3 the retirement board of the city of Springfield, or by the
4 retirement appeal board of the commonwealth, the
5 retirement board of the city of Springfield shall provide
6 that a medical panel selected in the manner set forth
7 in section six of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws
8 make a physical examination of Patrick J. Haggerty of
9 said Springfield, an applicant for retirement for acci-
10 dental disability. In the event that said retirement
11 board, upon certification by said medical panel, finds that
12 said Patrick J. Haggerty is entitled to accidental dis-
13 ability retirement, he shall be retired for accidental dis-
14 ability as a Group A employee of the city of Springfield
15 as of the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred
16 and fifty-four, and his retirement allowance shall there-
17 upon be computed and paid in accordance with the pro-
18 visions of said chapter thirty-two.
