RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS TO PREVENT THE CLOSING OF THE U. S. PUBLIC HEALTH HOSPITAL ALSO KNOWN AS THE BRIGHTON MARINE HOSPITAL IN BRIGHTON.

Whereas, The proposed closing of the U. S. Public Health Hospital, also known as the Brighton Marine Hospital, in Brighton would cause great inconvenience to merchant seamen, members of the U. S. Coast Guard and disabled war veterans, and would greatly lessen the hospital facilities available for such merchant seamen, members of the U. S. Coast Guard and veterans; therefore be it

Resolved, That the house of representatives of the general court of Massachusetts urgently requests that the federal government take such steps as may be necessary to prevent the closing of said hospital; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent by the secretary of the commonwealth to the President of the United States, to the secretary of the army, and to each member of Congress from this commonwealth.
