AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF CERTAIN JUSTICES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section
2 four of chapter seven hundred and forty-two of the acts
3 of nineteen hundred and fifty-one, section one of chapter
4 five hundred and sixty-seven of the acts of nineteen
5 hundred and fifty-three, and section one of chapter six
6 hundred and fifty-one of the acts of nineteen hundred
7 and fifty-four, any justice of the superior court who was
8 appointed to said office between the second day of June
9 and the thirty-first day of December in the year nine-
10 teen hundred and fifty-four, both dates inclusive, shall
11 receive such salary as is provided by section twenty-
12 seven of chapter two hundred and twelve of the General
13 Laws, as amended by section two of chapter seven hun-
14 dred and forty-two of the acts of nineteen hundred and
15 fifty-one.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January
2 first, nineteen hundred and fifty-five.
