## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Five.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE THE QUESTION OF LIMITING THE HOURS OF DUTY OF PERMANENT MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF SAID CITY TO FORTY-TWO HOURS PER WEEK.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provisions  
2 of chapter forty-eight of the General Laws, there may  
3 be submitted to the voters of the city of Cambridge at  
4 its regular city election in the current year the following  
5 question which shall be placed upon the official ballot  
6 to be used at said election: —“Shall the hours of duty of  
7 permanent members of the fire department of this city  
8 be limited to forty-two hours per week?” If a majority  
9 of votes cast in answer to said question is in the affirma-  
10 tive, the hours of duty of permanent members of the  
11 fire department shall be limited to forty-two hours per  
12 week ninety days thereafter.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage  
2 for the sole purpose of being submitted to the voters as  
3 aforesaid.
