AN ACT PERMITTING THE MANUFACTURE OF SAUSAGE CONTAINING COLORING MATTER AND REGULATING THE SALE THEREOF.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 143 of chapter 94 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by chapter 318 of the acts of
3 1930, is hereby further amended by adding at the end of
4 said section the following sentence:— Nothing in this
5 section shall prohibit the manufacture of sausage con-
6 taining coloring matter; provided, that the same is not
7 sold for consumption within the commonwealth; and
8 only for the purpose of export outside of the common-
9 wealth.
