RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS RELATIVE TO THE CLOSING OF THE GURNET POINT LIFE SAVING STATION.

Whereas, The coast guard has for many years maintained a coast guard station at Gurnet Point in Plymouth; and

Whereas, Many lives have been saved by the personnel stationed at this station; and

Whereas, The boating population is steadily increasing in this area; and

Whereas, This station was deactivated on May twenty-ninth; now therefore be it

Resolved, That the house of representatives of the general court of Massachusetts urges the members of Congress from this commonwealth to take the necessary steps to cause the immediate reactivation of this important and necessary life-saving medium; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of these resolutions be sent forthwith by the secretary of the commonwealth to the President of the United States and all members of Congress from this commonwealth.
