*Whereas*, The Boston Red Sox, bolstered by the return of Ted Williams, have won 24 of their last 29 games, and have just completed a road trip wherein they won eight out of nine games played, including a great double victory over the New York Yankees on July 4th; and

*Whereas*, The Boston Red Sox have climbed from seventh to fourth place during this period, and are now only three games out of second place and eight games from first place; therefore be it

*Resolved*, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives hereby congratulates the Boston Red Sox players, coaches, manager and staff for this splendid showing, which has greatly enthused the sports fans of New England and Boston, and urges them to redoubled efforts to bring the American League pennant and World Championship of baseball to Massachusetts; and be it further
