To accompany the petition of Philip G. Bowker and another for legislation to compensate Charles Freed and Samuel Malins for loss sustained by them as sub-contractors on certain State projects. Ways and Means, Joint.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF CHARLES FREED AND SAMUEL MALINS,
CO-PARTNERS, DOING BUSINESS UNDER THE FIRM NAME OF
FREED-MALINS ELECTRIC CO., OF BOSTON.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging a moral
2 obligation of the commonwealth, and subject to appro-
3 priation, there shall be paid from the state treasury the
4 sum of two thousand sixty-four dollars and forty-eight
5 cents to Charles Freed and Samuel Malins, co-partners,
6 doing business under the firm name of Freed-Malins
7 Electric Co., of Boston, to reimburse them for loss sus-
8 tained as subcontractors on Massachusetts state project
9 M-121, hospital building, and Massachusetts state
10 project M-216, fire alarm system, at Walter E. Fernald
11 state school, in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-one,
12 whereby said firm was engaged by contract to perform
13 for the commonwealth and did perform certain elec-
14 trical work, and by reason of certain erroneous informa-
15 tion said contract represented that said work was to be
16 performed in the town of Belmont, whereas in fact said
17 work was to be performed in the city of Waltham, and
18 by reason of said erroneous information said firm was
19 required to pay to employees extra travel time to said
20 amount in accordance with union regulations, the travel
21 charges to said city being greater by said amount than
22 the travel charges to said town. No payment shall be
23 made hereunder until there has been filed with the

24 comptroller an agreement signed by said Charles Freed
 25 and Samuel Malins that the amount, if any, paid or to
 26 be paid for legal services rendered in connection with
 27 the passage of this resolve shall not exceed ten per cent
 28 of the amount paid or payable hereunder.
