AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES UNDER CIVIL SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The positions of laborers in the service of the divi-
2 sion of forests and parks in the department of natural
3 resources, formerly known as conservation helpers and
4 conservation workers, in the service of the division of
5 forestry and of the division of parks and reservations
6 in the department of conservation, shall, on the effec-
7 tive date of this act, be classified under the civil serv-
8 ice laws and rules, and the persons employed in such
9 positions on December thirty-first, nineteen hundred
10 and fifty-three shall continue to serve in such positions
11 and the term of their office shall be unlimited, subject,
12 however, to the civil service laws and rules.
