AN ACT PROVIDING THAT APPLICANTS FOR A SPORTING, HUNTING, FISHING, OR TRAPPING LICENSE NEED NOT PERSONALLY APPEAR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 6 of chapter 131 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the fourth sentence as appear-
3 ing in section 1 of chapter 302 of the acts of 1948.

To receive the report of the committee on the subject of the proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of New York, and to report thereon to the Senate.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

THE SENATE OF MASSACHUSETTS, in the year one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, passed the following resolution, to-wit:

Resolved, That the committee on the subject of the proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of New York, be and they are hereby authorized to receive the report of the committee on the subject of the proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of New York, and to report thereon to the Senate.
