To accompany the petition of Mario Umana for legislation relative to the compensation of certain chief probation officers and assistant chief probation officers in Suffolk County. Counties.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN CHIEF PROBATION OFFICERS AND ASSISTANT CHIEF PROBATION OFFICERS IN SUFFOLK COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 83 of chapter 276 of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the first para-
3 graph, as appearing in section 1 of chapter 420 of the
4 acts of 1953, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 paragraph:—

6 In the Boston juvenile court, the chief probation offi-
7 cer and the assistant chief probation officer shall receive
8 as an annual salary, seventy-five per cent and sixty per
9 cent, respectively, of the salary provided by law for the
10 justice of said court, and every other probation officer
11 shall receive the same salary as that paid to probation
12 officers of the Boston municipal court.

13 In every district court in Suffolk county, other than
14 the municipal court of the city of Boston, the chief pro-
15 bation officer, if any, shall be compensated for his services
16 as if he held an office classified under the classification
17 and compensation plans of said county in the same grade
18 as the clerk of court in which said chief probation officer
19 serves; and the assistant chief probation officer, if any,
20 shall be compensated for his services as if he held an

21 office classified under said compensation and classification
22 plans in the same grade as the first assistant clerk of
23 said court; and every other probation officer shall re-
24 ceive the same salary as that paid to probation officers
25 in the Boston municipal court.

1 SECTION 2. The compensation currently being paid
2 to any chief probation officer, assistant chief probation
3 officer, or probation officer shall not be reduced because
4 of the passage of this act.
