To accompany the petition of Konstantin K. Paluev for legislation to limit experiments with artificial fluoridation of water for human consumption to those human beings who volunteer for such experiments and to animals. Public Health.

AN ACT LIMITING EXPERIMENTS WITH ARTIFICIAL FLUORIDATION OF WATER FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION TO THOSE HUMAN BEINGS WHO VOLUNTEER FOR SUCH EXPERIMENTS AND TO ANIMALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 No experiment relating to the use of fluorine in water
- 2 for human consumption shall be performed except upon
- 3 human beings who voluntarily subject themselves to such
- 4 experiment, and to animals.

The Constitution of the State

The Bill for the Amendment of the Constitution

The Senate has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the bill for the amendment of the Constitution, and to inform you that it has been referred to the Committee on the Constitution, and that they have reported thereon to the Senate on the 15th day of January, 1890.

The bill is entitled "An Act to amend the Constitution of the State in relation to the election of judges of the Supreme Court, and to provide for the election of judges of the District Courts."

The bill is in conformity with the provisions of the Constitution, and it is recommended that it be passed.
