AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN PERSONS SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FROM THE COMMONWEALTH A BONUS FOR SERVICES DURING THE KOREAN EMERGENCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The benefits of chapter four hundred and forty of the
2 acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-three are hereby ex-
3 tended to any person who between June twenty-fifth,
4 nineteen hundred and fifty, and January thirty-first,
5 nineteen hundred and fifty-five, both dates inclusive,
6 enlisted for a term of four years or six years in the
7 armed forces of the United States, who was domiciled
8 as required by said act, and who served in the said
9 armed forces in active service for not less than three
10 years subsequent to June twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred
11 and fifty, and who is not otherwise entitled to said bene-
12 fits solely for the reason that he has not received a dis-
13 charge, under honorable conditions, from the armed
14 forces.
