AN ACT TO RELEASE CERTAIN INTERESTS, RIGHTS AND RESTRICTIONS AFFECTING LAND ON ARLINGTON STREET AND COMMONWEALTH AVENUE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 All the proprietary right, title and interest by way of
2 reversion, right of re-entry or otherwise, remaining to
3 the commonwealth in that tract of land in the city of
4 Boston bounded northerly by Commonwealth avenue,
5 easterly by Arlington street, southerly by public alley
6 number four hundred and thirty-seven, and westerly by
7 a line parallel with, and one hundred and forty-seven
8 feet westerly from, the westerly line of Arlington street
9 is hereby released to the respective owners of the parcels
10 of land comprising said tract.
