AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF MALDEN TO USE THE UNEXPENDED BALANCE OF A CERTAIN SCHOOL LOAN FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty of  
2 chapter forty-four of the General Laws, the city of  
3 Malden is hereby authorized to appropriate, for the  
4 purpose of purchasing school equipment and supplies,  
5 the unexpended balance of thirty thousand dollars re-  
6 maining of a loan made by said city under the provisions  
7 of chapter six hundred and forty-five of the acts of  
8 nineteen hundred and forty-eight for constructing,  
9 equipping and furnishing the new Linden school, so  
10 called.
