AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ENCLOSURE BY PIPE OR CONDUIT OF A PORTION OF FURNACE BROOK IN QUINCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby au-
2 thorized and directed to enclose Furnace brook in the
3 city of Quincy, between Adams street and Quarry street,
4 by a conduit or pipe; provided, that no expense shall be
5 incurred for the work authorized hereunder until all
6 owners or abutters of said Furnace brook shall have au-
7 thorized said work and executed releases to said com-
8 mission releasing said commission and the common-
9 wealth from any and all claims arising from said work
10 and from any liability thereafter for defects or want of
11 repair in said work. No assessment shall be made on
12 any owner or abuttor for the cost of said work; and the
13 doing of said work shall not obligate said commission or
14 the commonwealth to maintain said conduit or pipe.
15 For the purposes of this act, said commission may ex-
16 pend such sums not exceeding, in the aggregate, fifty
17 thousand dollars, as may hereafter be appropriated
18 therefor.
