AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OBSERVANCE OF SENIOR CITIZENS DAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after section 15A, inserted by chapter 170 of
3 the acts of 1953, the following section:—

4 *Section 15B.* The governor shall annually issue a pro-
5 clamation setting aside the fourth Sunday in May as Sen-
6 ior Citizens Day, recommending its observance by the
7 public in honoring the elder citizens of the common-
8 wealth.
